Dr. James Brown (PharmD '02) is a master at what he does – just ask the UNM student pharmacists he mentors. Always generous with his time, Dr. Brown offers the Advanced Hospital Practice Experience course (a graduation requirement of UNM's Doctor of Pharmacy program) to as many students in a year as we have rotation blocks.

An exemplary role model, Dr. Brown displays the utmost level of professionalism in his daily interactions, and encourages students to compliment what they've learned in the classroom through hands-on training in a genuine hospital setting. As a preceptor, Dr. Brown displays a commitment to "providing a comprehensive learning environment" and often discusses "managerial concepts like Accountability Ladder, Be Here Now, and Shadow of a Leader." When addressing management, Dr. Brown has a wellspring of extensive leadership experience both within and outside of the profession from which to draw.

In addition to being Director of Pharmacy at Kindred Hospital, Dr. Brown also serves on two Kindred Healthcare corporate committees, as treasurer of the UNM College of Pharmacy's alumni society, as a member of the New Mexico Coalition for Asthma, as a board member on the New Mexico Alzheimer golf fundraiser and as an expert witness in pharmacy law for lawyers in and around New Mexico.

Outside of his pharmacy life, Dr. Brown is the owner of the local brewery, Quarter Celtic Brewpub and Wholesale, was the district manager who brought CVS to New Mexico, and is a United States Navy veteran who served in Gulf War Operations Desert Storm and Desert Shield.
