# Research Office highlights

### **Arsenic and Zinc**

More than 200 million people worldwide are chronically exposed to arsenic in drinking water at concentrations above those considered safe by the World Health Organization. Drs. **Jim Liu** and **Scott Burchiel** received a new National Insititutes of Health R01 grant to study the health effects of exposure to arsenic, which occurs naturally and widely exists in the environment. The five year, \$1.7 million grant will allow the team to specifically study a novel mechanism by which arsenic disrupts red blood cell production. Drs. Liu and Burchiel believe their study will demonstrate that zinc supplements are a potentially effective treatment and preventative intervention to mitigate the adverse health effects of arsenic-induced anemia

### **Neonatal Abstinence Syndrome**

The nation's opioid epidemic is an increasingly pressing public health problem. Perhaps the most vulnerable to suffering from its repercussions are infants and children, born to women with opioid use disorder, who were prenatally exposed to opiods. UNM COP Regents' Professor Ludmila Bakhireva, and her Texas A&M collaborator, Dr. Rajesh Miranda, were awarded an exploratory/development grant from the National Institute of Child Health & Human Development in the amount of \$425K over two years. The grant will be used to assess an infant epigenetic biomarker that precedes and predicts those born with neonatal abstinence syndrome (NAS) and to better understand the substantial variability in NAS incidence, onset, duration, and severity. Eventually, the team hopes to proactively predict the severity of NAS - before the onset of physical withdrawal, further diminish effects of drug exposure, and provide neuroprotection in infants. According to Dr. Bakhireva, such knowledge has the potential to improve short- and long-term outcomes for the growing number of U.S. infants prenatally exposed to opioids, and could also change current standards of care for NAS.

### PEPPOR Student Wins NMPHA Award

Shikhar Shrestha, BPharm, MS, PhDc, a graduate student in the College's Pharmacoeconomics, Epidemiology, Pharmaceutical Policy and Outcomes Research program, recently won 2nd place in the student poster competition at the New Mexico Public Health Association's 2018 Annual Conference. His poster was entitled "Association Between Moderate Alcohol Use in Pregnancy and Impaired Self-Regulation in Infants at 6 Months." Shrestha's mentor and dissertation chair, Dr. Ludmila Bakhireva, states, "I am very proud of Shikhar's continuous success and his outstanding achievements. He is truly an exceptional student who year after year demonstrates his excellence in scholarship and is actively involved in the teaching and service missions of the College."
